Hiking Merit Badge

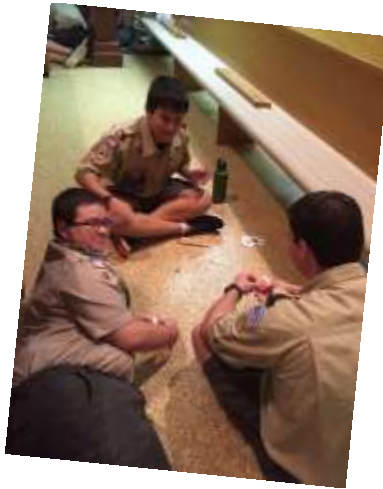
