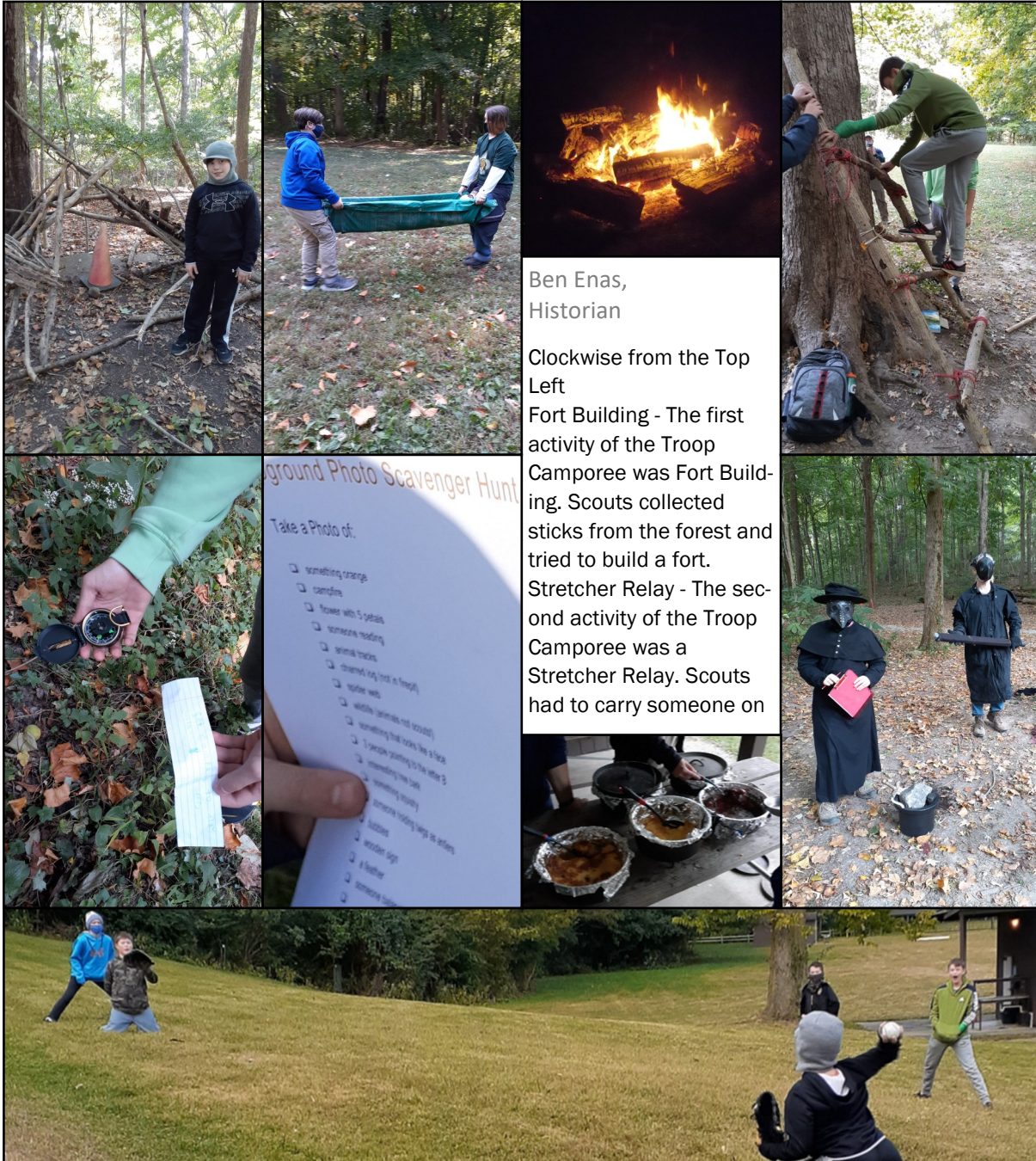
OA Lodge Ordeal

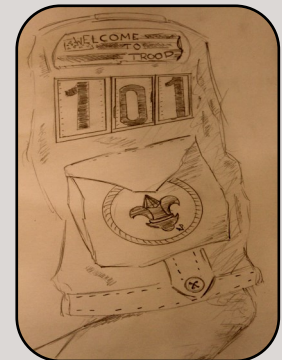
